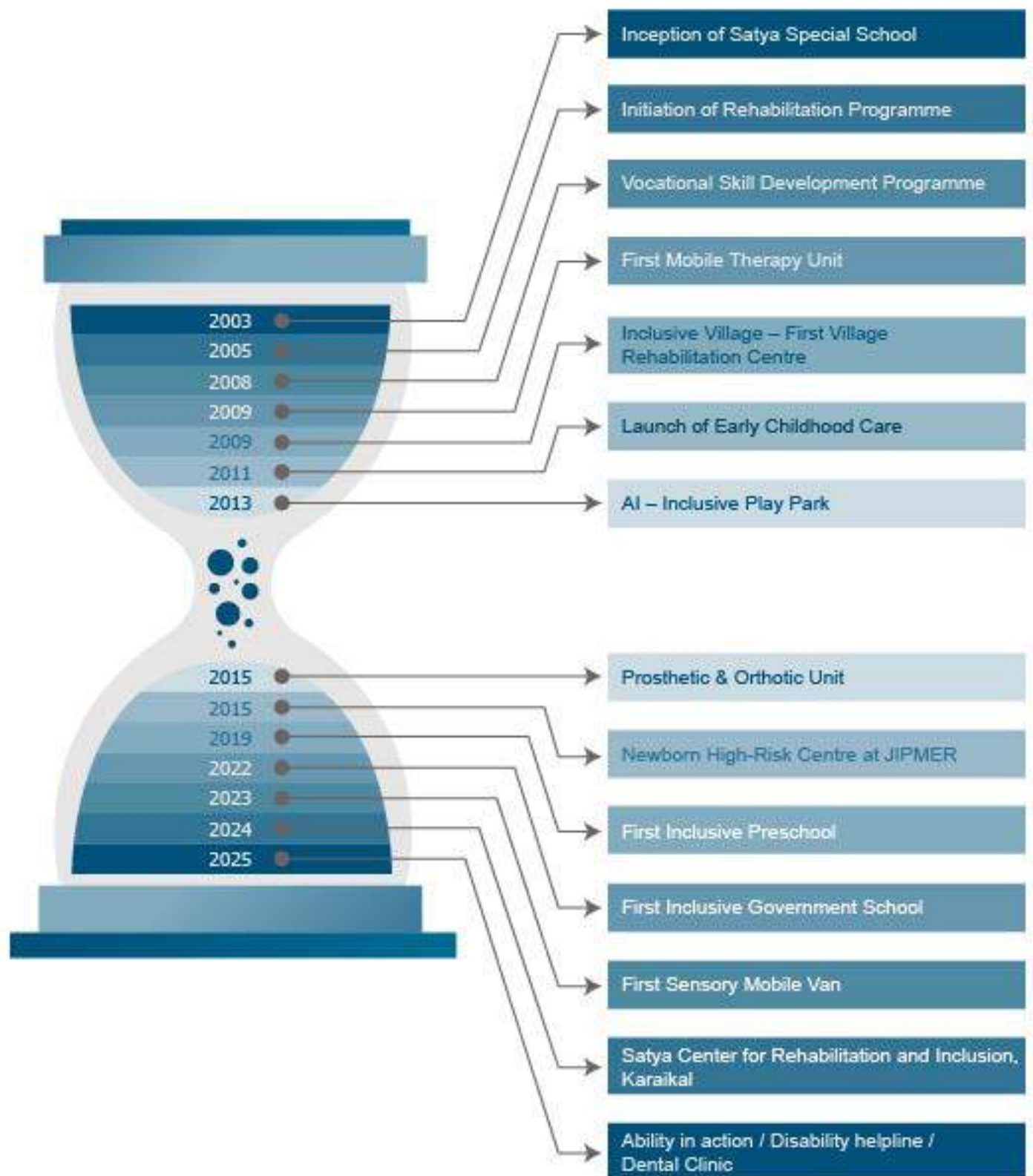

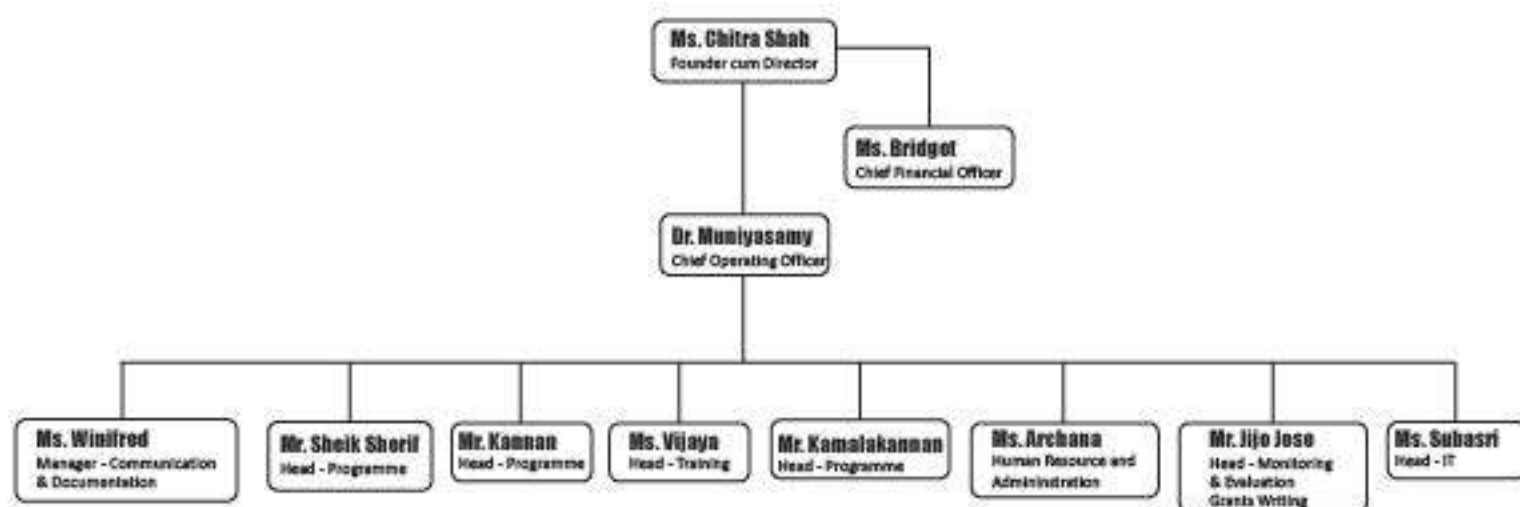

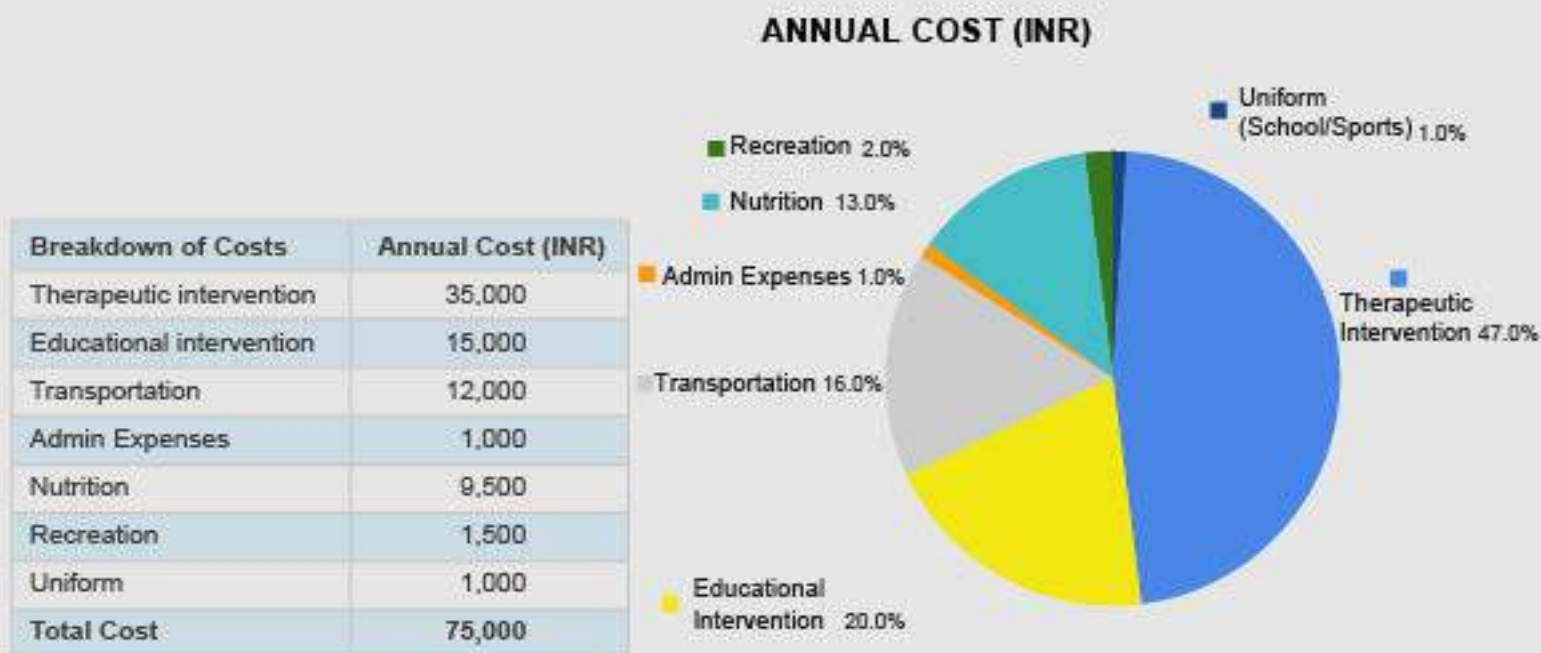
Satya Special School stands alone in the region, reaching rural children with disabilities through mobile therapy units and outreach centres.

High-risk clinic

Satya Special School's Early Intervention Centre, in affiliation with JIPMER Hospital, offers hope for high-risk newborns. Its Newborn High-Risk (NBHR) Clinic affirms life since it declares each baby deserves the chance for an inclusive, healthy future from the start.

Our clinic screens infants from the NICU who are discharged every month. About 80% of these infants get regular follow-up care. This is not just about the monitoring it is about the empowering of parents. Customized

therapies deliver growth along with independence as they identify early signs of developmental delays that nurture.

Our dedicated multidisciplinary team provides a comprehensive circle of care, including psychologists, special educators, physiotherapists, and more. Each session brings us closer to our goal, ensuring that no child slips through all of the cracks.

Tech in Satya (Virtual Reality & Hash hack code)

At Satya Special School, innovation drives inclusion. Through a powerful collaboration with Hash Hack Code, we launched CODE LAB an accessible space where neurodiverse and rural learners explore the world of coding. Our first batch began their journey diving into creative, personalized tech learning that builds confidence, curiosity, and career skills. At CODE LAB, everyone can code, regardless of ability.

In parallel, our pioneering use of Virtual Reality (VR) integrated with Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) is

revolutionizing therapy for children with intellectual disabilities. These immersive, real-world simulations help students practice life skills, improve focus, and build emotional resilience in a safe, engaging environment.

Whether it's coding or VR, each innovation at Satya is designed to empower learners at their own pace fostering adaptability, independence, and joy. By blending technology with compassion, we're redefining what's possible in special education and proving that inclusive tech is transformative tech.

A first-of-its-kind dental clinic exclusively for children with special needs, "Beyond Smiles" was launched at Satya Special School with support from leading institutions. Equipped with an inclusive dental chair donated by L&T Prayas Trust, the clinic goes beyond oral care it's about

dignity, access, and compassion. Hearing "Danth Sayak" graduates share their journey added warmth to the launch, proving that smiles go deeper when backed by inclusion.

industry-specific roles. With a custom curriculum designed for real-world impact, this initiative redefines what's possible for PWDs in employment and technical fields.

Helpline – A Lifeline for Inclusion

Navigating life with a disability shouldn't mean doing it alone. Satya's Disability Helpline offers real-time support to parents and caregivers in Puducherry and Karaikal, guiding them on government schemes, jobs, education, and housing. It's more than a helpline it's a bridge to empowerment. For many, that first call is not just a query answered but hope rekindled and dignity restored.



Feeding India

In partnership with Zomato Feeding India (Hunger Heroes), Satya Special School ensured over 129,030 nourishing meals this year, worth ₹70 lakh—and reached 500+ children with disabilities across six centres in Puducherry and nearby districts. From breakfast to snacks, each meal was more than food: it was dignity, care, and the chance to learn and grow. Centres served included 107 at our main school, 105 at the Center for Unique Learners & Autism, 93 at Kulapalayam, and 205 across three Village Rehabilitation Centres. Additionally, Feeding India supported our community with 1,000 relief kits for flood-affected families, each valued at ₹3,500. Together with Zomato Feeding India, we're fighting hunger, responding to crises, and building an inclusive future, one meal at a time.

Wipro's Inclusive Education Program at Kolakarai School: A Beacon of Progress

The WIPRO-supported "Inclusive" program at Kolakarai School stands as a transformative force that makes equal learning opportunities a reality. The partnership between Kolakarai School and Satya Special School creates an inclusive educational setting where students with different abilities achieve remarkable success together. The school implements accessible facilities together with customized education strategies and trained staff to break down obstacles that appear insurmountable. The initiative stands out through its genuine student connections, the compassionate bonds formed through peer buddy

systems, and parental pride in their children's advancement. Through therapy sessions, inclusive sports programs, and creative activities, students have developed hidden abilities and self-assurance. The school has evolved beyond its educational function to become a community that provides a sense of belonging to all its members. The program achieves more than just classroom changes by reshaping attitudes and promoting diversity while demonstrating universal growth through inclusive practices.



Thirankoodu: From Survival to Self-Reliance

Thirankoodu is not just a livelihood program it's a movement of resilience. Spearheaded by Satya Special School, this initiative empowers 200 women from families of persons with disabilities to become entrepreneurs and changemakers. From financial literacy to market-ready skills, Thirankoodu transforms hidden talent into thriving

microenterprises. Through the formation of a women-led producer company, these once-marginalized women are now business leaders, role models, and voices of hope in their communities. What began as a response to poverty is now a ripple of prosperity, proving that dignity, income, and impact are possible when opportunity meets courage.

Deepshikha

Deepshikha Singh's visit to Satya Special School served as a powerful catalyst for a renewed and expanded vision of inclusion. Her perspective rooted in both expertise and empathy helped Satya move beyond seeing inclusion as a set of programs, instead recognizing it as a living movement and core identity.

Her perspective, combined with Wipro's Inclusion Assessment, encouraged Satya to refine systems, clarify roles, and align the entire team around a shared vision for an "Inclusive Tomorrow." This transformation led to measurable impact reaching 12 schools, empowering 150 children, training 500 teachers, and sensitizing over 5,000 community members while embedding inclusion as the school's core identity, not just an initiative. Deepshikha's visit helped Satya redefine what's possible, making inclusion a living, evolving movement at every level.



A Journey Through Hope: Farida Kathawalla's Visit

Farida Kathawalla from Rebuild India made a profound connection with Satya Special School while touring its facilities. The organization demonstrated comprehensive change through its provision of newborn clinics, custom prosthetics, and inclusive classrooms together with its vibrant vocational centers. Her visit revealed not just services, but stories: of mothers who fight stigma, of children gaining mobility and confidence, of entire families

reclaiming dignity. Farida narrates the story of Satya's mission to deliver visibility and support to every disabled person through their strong resilience. The words of Farida serve as a reminder that at Satya the practice of inclusion represents an unbroken commitment that extends beyond programs.

Transforming Lives, One Child at a Time

Summary of Social Returns on Investment (SROI)

Satya Special School | Puducherry | 2022–2025

At Satya Special School, we have seen that real change often begins quietly—a child feeling safe, a parent finally exhaling, a teacher choosing to believe. Over three years of the Hans Project, these quiet shifts grew into something powerful. To truly understand this impact, we conducted a Social Return on Investment (SROI) study through an external assessment at the end of the project. It helped us put words and numbers to what we witness every day—the deep social, emotional, and educational value of inclusion. It's a reminder that the work we do touches far more than we sometimes see.

Our Mission in Action

From the very first screening of newborns to helping teenagers step confidently into school or work, our project makes sure no child is left behind. We combined early intervention, therapy, education, skill-building, and community awareness to redefine inclusion in Puducherry.

Impact in Numbers



Stories Behind the Stats

- **Children empowered:** Learning to walk, speak, care for themselves—reducing the daily burden on parents while restoring dignity and hope.
- **Families uplifted:** 258 parents trained for new livelihoods—returning to work, starting businesses, and gaining confidence and stability.
- **Communities transformed:** Over 300 children transitioned into mainstream schools or vocational programs—challenging stigma and building true inclusion.

Built on Partnerships

This success wasn't ours alone. It was built with parents, teachers, healthcare providers, and local leaders. By listening deeply and working side by side, we delivered solutions that truly worked—and will last.

Responsible and Thoughtful

We made sure every rupee counted. Skilled staff were our biggest investment, because children deserve dedicated care. Overhead costs were kept low, and with an average annual cost per child of ₹3,436.99, we showed that big impact doesn't have to mean big spending.

The Road Ahead

While we're proud of what we achieved, we know there's more to do. Children with autism need specialized, one-on-one support. Our next step is to build a dedicated Autism Centre—to ensure every child, no matter their needs, gets the care they deserve.

Why It Matters

This isn't just a project. It's a promise of dignity, opportunity, and hope for every child. The incredible return on investment proves what we've always believed: when you invest in children, you change the world. Let's keep going—together.

Special Olympics National Championship Games 2024–2025

Forty Special Athletes and ten Unified Partners showcased their talent at the National Championship Games, participating in Football, Female Badminton, Unified Volleyball, Bocce, and Bowling. Their impressive performances brought home multiple medals and reflected growing skills, confidence, and sportsmanship.



Asia Pacific Bocce & Bowling Games – Delhi

Our coach, Mr. Arun, was chosen as part of the Indian coaching team for the Asia Pacific Bocce Games in Delhi, providing invaluable training and mentorship at an international level. Additionally, Ms. Deepa, our team psychologist, supported athlete well-being through the Strong Minds Screening Program during the event.

FROM CAREGIVERS TO CHANGE MAKER...



At Satya Special School, we know that mothers of children with disabilities often carry the entire weight of caregiving, leaving little room for their growth or income. To change this reality, we designed practical training programs to help mothers develop valuable skills while balancing family responsibilities.

After completing this training, many mothers have been directly employed within Satya. They now work as classroom aides, early intervention assistants, vocational trainers, and administrative staff, all in an environment that understands and supports their unique challenges.

By offering these jobs, Satya not only provides financial stability but also restores confidence and dignity. Mothers who once struggled in isolation are now respected professionals and role models, showing their children and the community that with the right support, every woman can thrive.

At Satya, empowering mothers means strengthening families and building a more inclusive, compassionate society.

CAPACITY PROGRAM

Internal Training: Growing Together, One Session at a Time



This year, 62 internal training sessions brought over 2,800 people: staff, parents, caregivers, and students into a deeper understanding. From child rights and nutrition to mental health and inclusive sports, we focused on what matters. More than 2,000 students from 23 colleges were also sensitized, carrying the message of inclusion beyond our walls. One parent told us, "I had suicidal thoughts

before. The training changed my life." That's the kind of impact we strive for. Staff gained confidence. CRAs discovered their strengths and pursued higher studies. Students opened their minds to inclusion. These weren't just sessions; they were conversations that brought healing, clarity, and purpose. At Satya, we believe that when you know better, you do better.

External Training: Listening, Learning, and Leading in the Community



We held 25 community-based programs this year, reaching over 3,400 people from Anganwadi workers and schoolteachers to parents and panchayat leaders. These sessions were simple, heartfelt, and real focused on spotting disability early, reducing stigma, and knowing where to turn for help. In villages where silence used to surround disability, people are now talking, acting, and supporting. Children once hidden are now being referred for care. These trainings didn't just share information; they started a quiet but powerful shift in how communities think and act. Bit by bit, village by village, we're growing a culture of understanding and inclusion.
