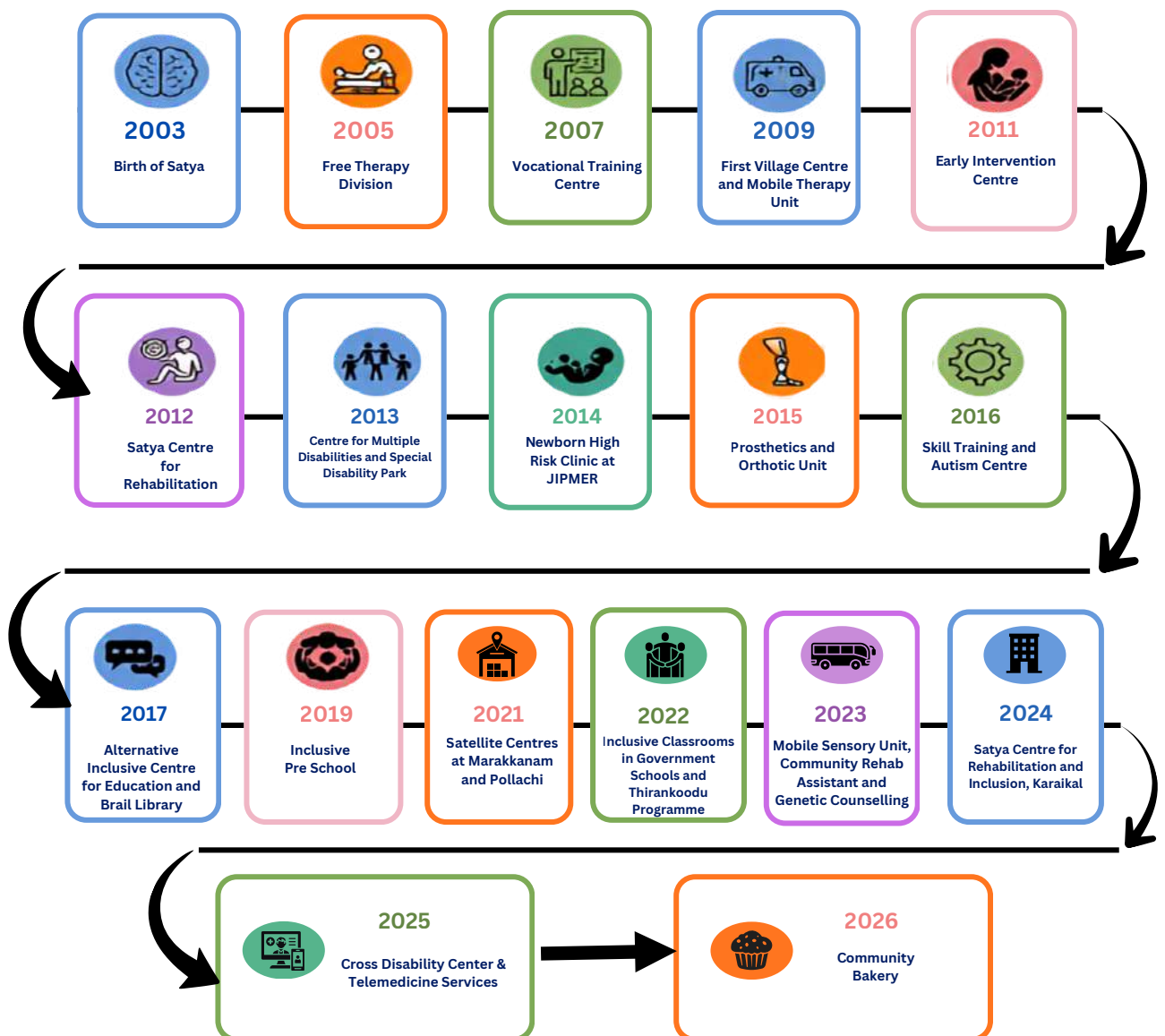
The Journey of Satya

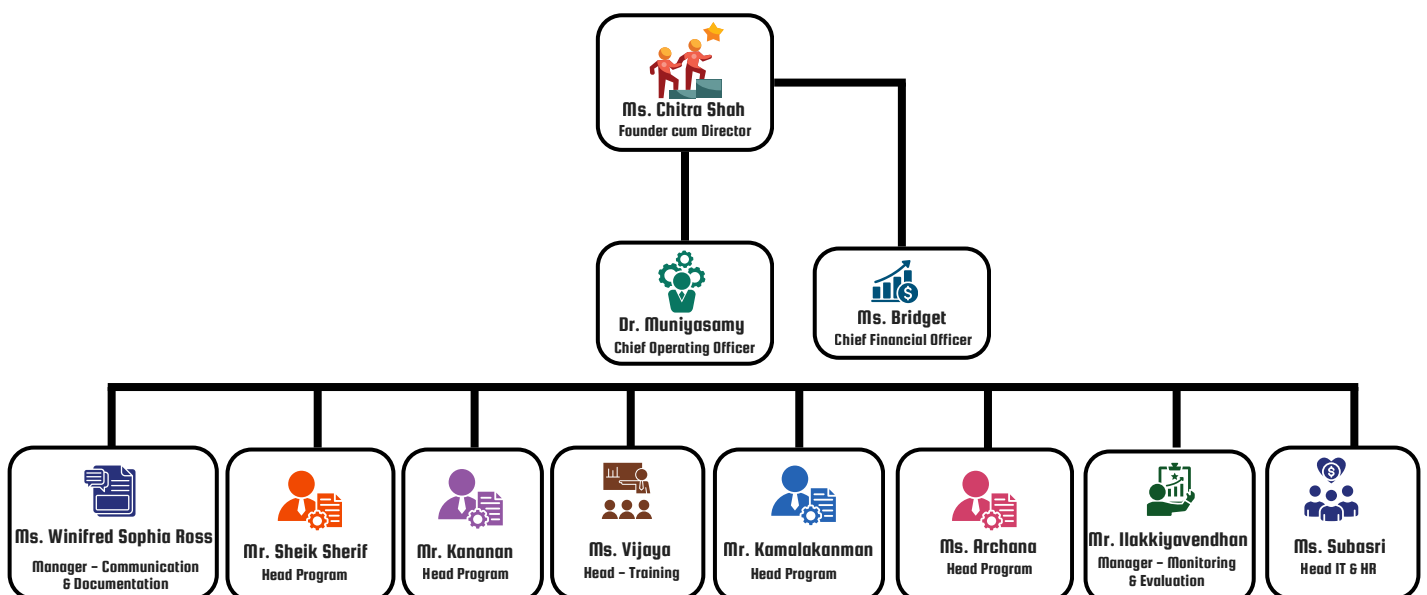

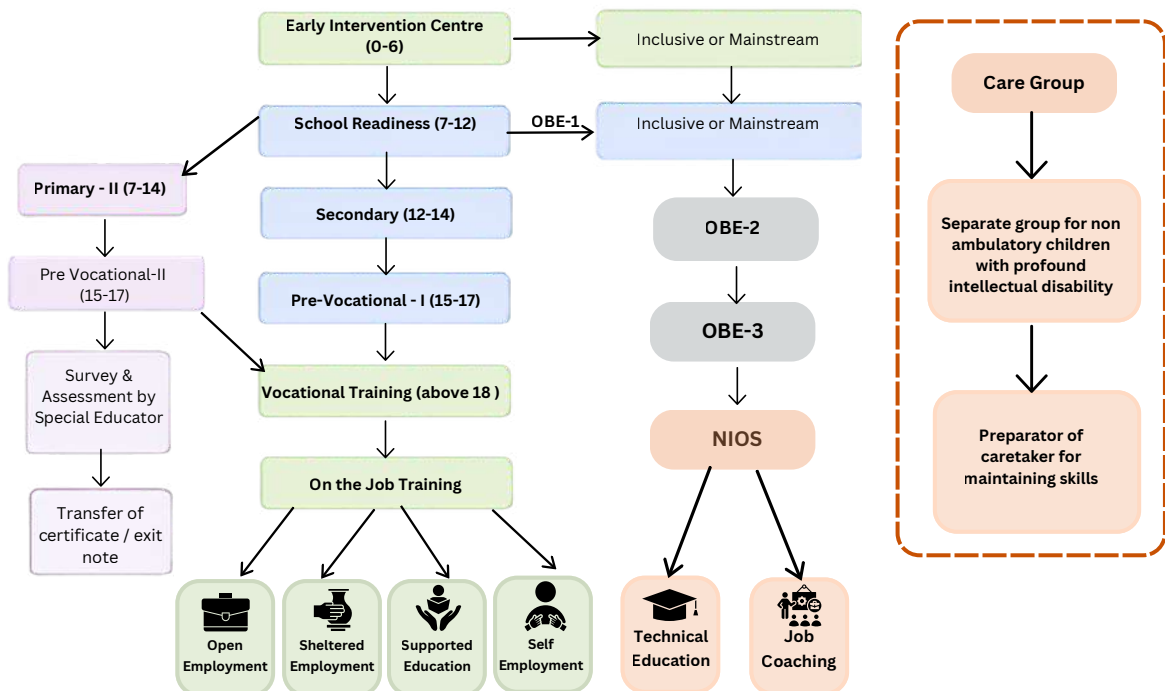

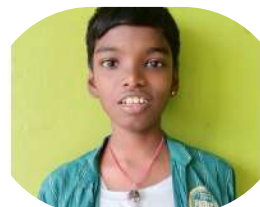

He is a child with Autism Spectrum Disorder, joined Satya with limited communication, poor sitting tolerance, and wandering behaviour. Through Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Behaviour Modification, and Special Education, he developed the skills needed for classroom participation and has now been successfully mainstreamed into a Government school in Karaikal.

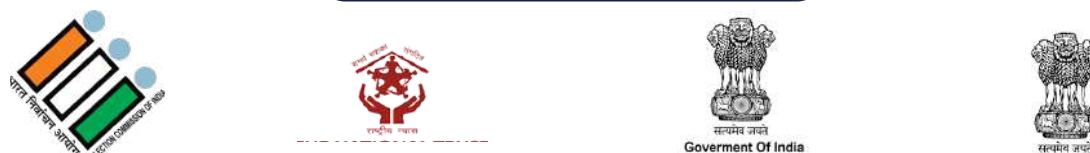
