Satya Special School was conceptualized and registered as a society in 2003 to extend rehabilitation facilities for people with intellectual disabilities. Satya started with a simple objective of including the excluded, with an aim to change the fragmented rehabilitation system into a more integrated and holistic one.

We provide disability rehabilitation including Early identification, intervention, life skills training, continued educational programme, individual plan, therapeutic intervention, psychological and vocational intervention. Empower parents with the needed skills to prevent abandonment and encourage social inclusion.

Our Objective

To change the current fragmented rehabilitation system into a more integrated and holistic one dedicated to improving the lives of intellectually disabled children through individual specialized training thereby making social inclusion a reality

Satya's Early Childhood Programme: An initiative to aid parents identify early symptoms (age-group 0-6 years) so that the children are at a lesser risk of delayed growth. As a part of the programme Satya has collaborated with JIMPER'S NBHRC wherein we provide rehabilitation services for children who are at risk, follow up and rehabilitate them at our Urban Centers, VRCs, MTUs and Satellite Centres.

Holistic Programme for Children with Multiple Disabilities: An initiative to impart vocational skills based on the existing abilities of the PWDs leading to meaningful employment & sustainable livelihood facilitating social inclusion and acceptance. To utilise existing skill training programs to enrol our adults keeping in mind our final objective of social inclusion.

Community Based Rehabilitation: An initiative to promote community-based rehabilitation and social empowerment through integrated specialised programmes of rehabilitation, education and therapeutic intervention; social awareness on the inclusive education and supporting the enhancement of capacity of the stakeholders towards creating sustainability of the Village Rehabilitation Centres.
