Re-inauguration of Prosthetics and Orthotics Unit

On September 24, we re-inaugurated our Prosthetics and orthotics Unit. The occasion was graced by **Mr. C. Udaya Kumar, IAS, Secretary to Government of Pondicherry**. It's now an integrated centre for all prosthetics solutions including Assistive Paper Technology. We now manufacture CP Chairs, standing boards and other special aids and appliances.



Bringing kids back to school: Occupational Therapy Assessment

To gauge the impact of the pandemic on the growth and development of our children at Satya, we decided to call a group of 5 specialised therapists from Chennai to do a re-assessment of the children.

The specialists found that children had been adversely affected by COVID and the lockdown, exhibiting a range of symptoms, including obsessive and attention-seeking behaviour, weight gain and loss, lack of confidence, restlessness, irritability, and mood swings.


To overcome each of their problems, the specialists provided an individual plan for each child.




